BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah expresses its concern that the terms of the agreement whereby the United States withdrew the commitment under "Other Recreational Services" have not been made available to members of Congress, to the Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Committee, or to state oversight commissions on international trade, and calls upon the USTR to make public the agreement terms.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah expresses its concern that United States' trading partners may attempt to bring further claims against federal and state gambling laws under trade and investment agreements that lack the "public morals" exception found in the WTO GATS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the WTO, USTR, Utah Congressional delegation, and members of the U.S. Senate Finance and House Ways and Means Committees.
